

Electronic Waste (“E-Waste”) Collection

The Pennsylvania Covered Device Recycling Act, enacted in 2010, requires residents to keep devices such as computers, laptops, monitors, and televisions, out of the trash.

The Borough’s trash collection services no longer pick up televisions and computer equipment. Computer equipment includes: laptops, monitors, CPU’s, printers, scanners, keyboards, mice, speakers, cables and battery backups.

These items, if placed at the curb, will be left at the curb and **property owners will be fined.**

As a service to our residents, we are offering you the opportunity to dispose of these items by bringing them to the Borough Hall.

Right now, this is a **free** service to residents.

Call or come to Borough Hall to make an appointment for dropping off on Monday or Friday (weather permitting).

HELP REDUCE POLLUTANTS FROM GETTING INTO OUR STREAMS

The following are some easy measures that every resident can do to help reduce, and possibly even prevent, harmful pollutants and debris from getting into the storm drain system and from being discharged into our streams.

- Practice “Grass cycling”—Letting lawn clippings lay to decompose and become a natural fertilizer, Sweep grass clippings from walks and drives after mowing.
- Reduce the use of fertilizers that contain Nitrogen and Herbicides.
- Compost leaves and other yard waste.
- Reduce the amount of salt and other deicing chemicals used on walks and drives.
- Wash vehicles at car washes that recycle wash water.
- Sweep your walks, curbs and gutters, dispose of the debris collected in the trash.
- Help keep storm drains cleared of debris.
- **Report any illegal dumping of all oil or other chemicals into the storm drains!**
- Volunteer to start an “Adopt—a –Road” program to pick up debris from your street.

If everyone does their part, the Borough can successfully work toward improving and preserving the quality of the water in the streams.

Many properties in Millbourne are not being maintained as they should. Pictures of violations will be sent with the Notice of Violation to the property owner. If clean-up or repairs are not made within the given number of days, a ticket will be issued to the property owner. If again the clean-up or repairs are not made and the ticket paid, a citation will be issued for a court date. We all must help to keep Millbourne looking as it should to attract new owners and renters.

Basement apartments are illegal. They pose health and safety issues.

Trash days are Tuesdays and Fridays with bulk collected on Fridays. Mattresses must be wrapped in plastic and can only go out on Fridays. Property owners will be ticketed immediately for mattress and bulk collection violations. Household trash should be in cans or heavy duty trash bags, not small flimsy bags. Please call 911 for emergencies, safety concerns and suspicious behavior.
Millbourne Borough residents should feel safe in their homes and on the street.
